#### Uniform

#### Homework Expectations

Each week, your child will receive 3 pieces of homework, which include: spelling, maths, times table rockstars and occasionally a topic or English related activity. We also expect your child to read every day at home both with an adult and independently for 15 minutes. Your child has a reading diary which should be used to record the texts that they read and to identify any words they struggled with. Homework will be set on a Friday each week and it should be completed/handed in by the following Thursday.

### **Healthy Lifestyles**

Cavendish Community Primary School is a healthy school and we promote healthy lifestyles. In KS2, your child can bring a healthy snack to eat during morning break time which should only be fresh fruit or vegetables. Your child should also have a refillable water bottle in school each day and this must only be filled with water. These should also be taken home daily to be cleaned.
