PE and Swimming

All year 4 classes will have swimming at Withington Baths on a Wednesday mornings and PE on a Friday morning. Your child should wear their school PE kit on their PE days. On a swimming day, the children should come in school uniform; often, children come in with their swimming kit underneath their uniform, ready to swim – just don't forget to pack underwear to change back into! All children are expected to swim each week and if they forget their swimming kit, a spare will be provided. Where children are exempt from swimming for a medical reason, a doctor's note must be brought to the office. A Class Dojo message or written





note from a parent/carer will not warrant an exemption from swimming. Please see below for a list of the kit required each week for swimming lessons.

- One piece swimming costume or swimming trunks
- Swimming cap
- Towel
- Underwear (if coming to school ready to swim)
- * Please note that whilst goggles are not forbidden, the coaches strongly suggest children learn without them, particularly when performing self-rescues.

Uniform

Your child should wear the appropriate school uniform each day in order to maintain our high standards. Your child should wear their school PE kit on their PE day. Please find below expectations for uniform at Cavendish and please ensure that every item is clearly named so any lost property can be returned.

We do PE outside in all weathers, so please make sure that your child is warmly dressed on cold PE days.

Homework Expectations

Each week, your child will receive homework, which include: spelling, grammar, maths and times tables. There will occasionally be other pieces of homework based on current learning and this will be communicated with you via Class Dojo. We also expect your child to read every day at home both with an adult and independently for 15 minutes. Your child will be given a reading journal which should be used to complete different activities about the text that they have read; some suggested activities will be sent home in September.





Homework will be set on a Friday each week and it should be completed by the following Wednesday. Times tables are very important in year 4 since the children will sit the year 4 multiplication tables check in June. In order to help with this, your child will have access to TTRS, which is a very popular and exciting online platform. This will help them to build their speed and confidence. Therefore, we encourage them to access TTRS regularly.

Healthy Lifestyles

Cavendish Community Primary School is a healthy school and we promote healthy lifestyles. In KS2, your child can bring a healthy snack to eat during morning break time which should only be fresh fruit or vegetables. Your child should also have a refillable water bottle in school each day and this must only be filled with water. These should also be taken home daily to be cleaned.
