All are welcome to a short presentation in the hall, followed by a tour of the Nursery and Reception spaces.

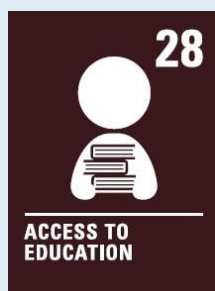
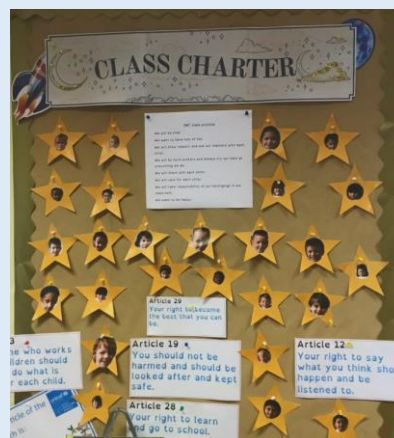
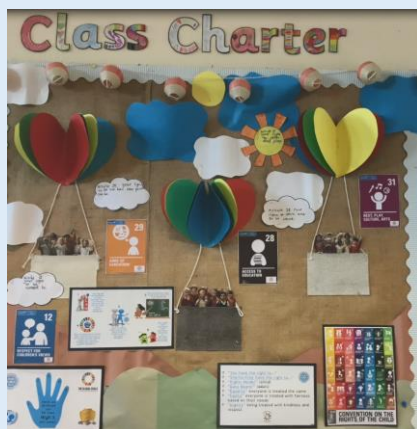

26 Find a new perspective on a problem you face

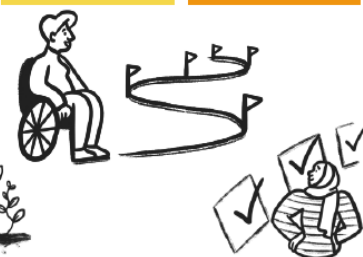
27 Be kind to yourself today. Remember, progress takes time

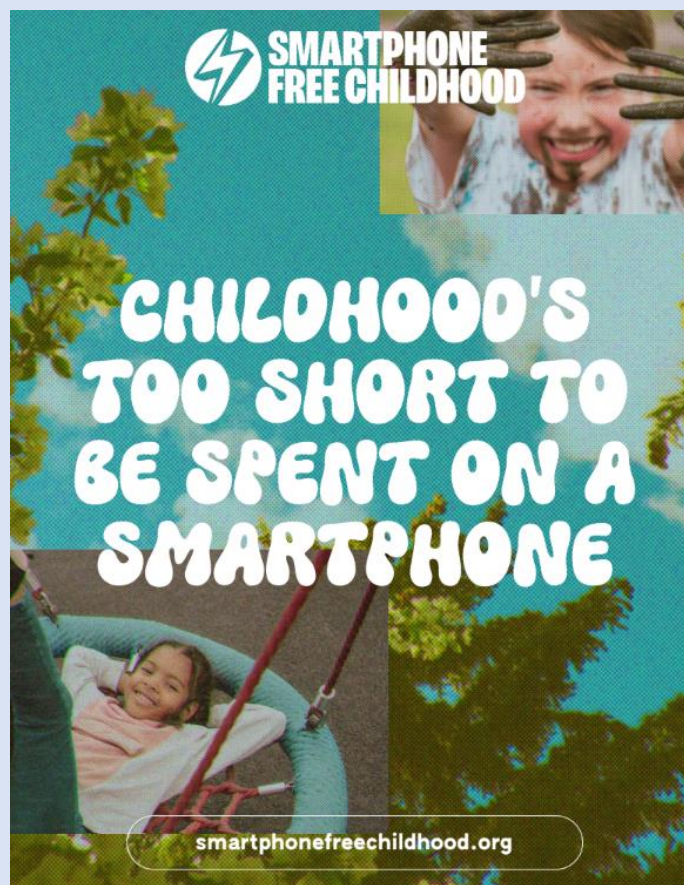

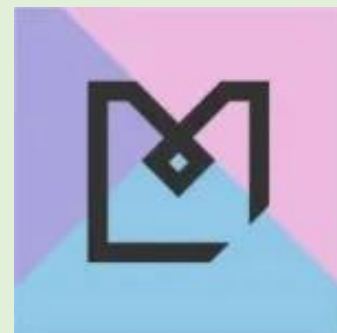
