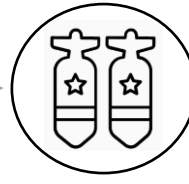

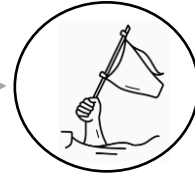

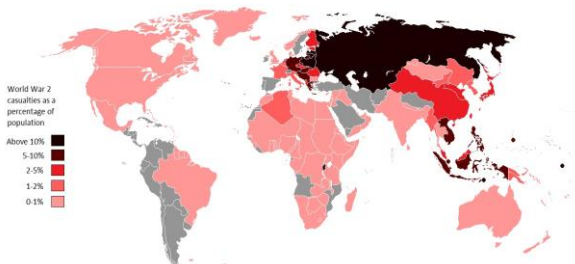

VOCABULARY

Conscription	Being made to join the armed forces to fight in a war.
Evacuee	Some one who is evacuated (forced to leave), usually for their own safety.
Ration	During the war, food supplies were low so you were only allowed a set amount per person.
Propaganda	Information (often inaccurate) which a political organization broadcasts to influence people.
The Blitz	Bombing raids on cities across Britain by German bombers.
Home front	The people who stay in a country and work while that country's soldiers are fighting in a war in a different country.
Luftwaffe	German Air Force
Spitfire	British military plane made famous in The Battle of Britain.
Fascism	A country lead by one leader who strictly controls all aspects of life and believes their way is best.
Allies	Your friend. Countries that work together in the war are allies.
