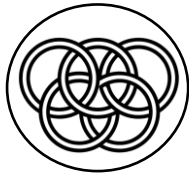

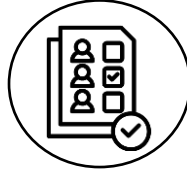
## Timeline of events

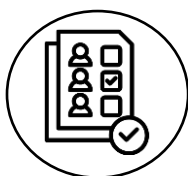
## Vocabulary

Civilisation	Civilization means a large group of people living together in an organized society with shared things like cities, language, culture, and leaders, who work together to create a stable community.
Athens	A powerful Greek city and where Democracy was born.
Democracy	A form of government where citizens have a say in how they are ruled including choosing their leaders and deciding on laws.
Oligarchy	A type of government where power is held by a few people.
Sparta	A powerful Greek city-state and rival to Athens, Sparta's culture was based around warfare and preparing for battle.
Olympics	The Olympics (or Olympic Games) are the world's foremost international multi-sport competitions featuring both Summer and Winter Games.

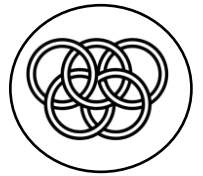
