Sew	Making stitches with a needle and thread	
needle	A thin piece of sharp metal with a hole (eye) for thread, which you sew with.	
thread	A long, thin strand of cotton.	
fabric	Cloth or other material produced by weaving or knitting fibres.	
bauble	A small trinket or decoration, usually hung on a Christmas tree.	
stitch	A loop created by threading with a needle in order to attach two pieces of material together.	
appealing	Something that is attractive or interesting.	
creativity	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something.	
design	A plan or drawing made to show the look or how something will work.	

Drawing templates A cut out of a shape to use when cutting around objects in material.
