Key learning aims

Unit: Guy Fawkes and the Houses of Parliament – Why do we celebrate Bonfire Night?

The aim of this unit is for pupils to:

- 1. Find out about events beyond living memory that are significant nationally
- 2. Deepen their understanding of the Gunpowder Plot
- 3. Increase their awareness of the past by finding out about Guy Fawkes and other significant people involved.
- 4. Compare the lives of people in 1605 to present day finding similarities and differences

The Royal Family – King Charles III

The aim of this unit is for pupils to:

- 1. Find out about events within living memory that are significant nationally
- 2. Deepen their understanding of the Royal Family
- 3. Know about significant evens in a monarch's life eg the Coronation.

NC Strands

Pupils will learn about an event beyond living memory that is significant nationally or globally: Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot.

Pupils will learn about changes within living memory. Where appropriate, these should be used to reveal aspects of change in national life: the UK Government and Parliament in the current day.
