### The Royal Family – King Charles III

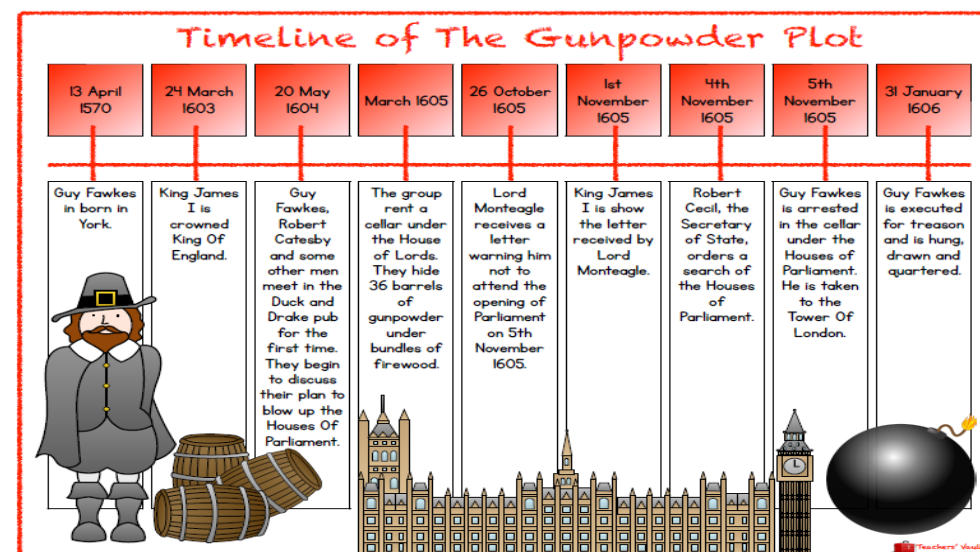
The aim of this unit is for pupils to:
