Can they write the letters?

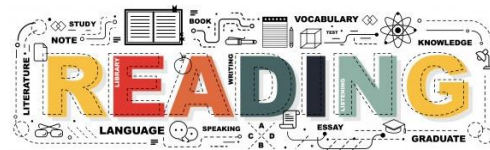
Can they spot the sound in books?
