All Saints Open Evening

This week our Year 5 and 6 pupils received a talk from Mr Parkes from All Saints High School. He spoke about the move from Year 6 to Year 7 and also explained that the existing pupils will be moving into the newest High School in the country from 21st October, when they transition into their new building on the same site. Gardeners and Seeds

At St Mary's, we are launching once more our 'Gardeners and Seeds' programme, a unique initiative designed to foster a nurturing and supportive school community. Throughout the year, the Gardeners and Seeds engage in various activities, whether it's sharing stories, participating in joint projects, or simply spending time together, these interactions help to build strong, lasting relationships that embody the core values of our Catholic faith.
