## **AUTUMN 2 - HOW ARE OTHER PEOPLE SPECIAL?**

**Communication and Language:** Working on individual next steps based on baseline assessments, enjoying listening to longer stories and remembering much of what happens. Understanding questions/instructions with two parts, singing a large repertoire of songs, developing their communication and pronunciation of multisyllabic words, expressing a point of view and debating when they disagree.

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development:** Talking about their feelings, developing their sense of responsibility and membership of a community through following collectively-agreed class rules and working together to look after the classroom and its resources. Showing more confidence in social situations by using friends' names and choosing to play with others, being increasingly independent with hand-washing and toileting, selecting and using activities and resources, achieving a goal they have chosen or has been suggested to them.

Physical Development: Developing movement, balancing and ball skills in the outdoor area, developing riding skills (scooters, trikes, balance bikes), deciding how to move based on their ability, e.g. walk/crawl along a plank. Using large-scale muscle movements to wave flags/streamers, paint and make marks, using one-handed tools (spade/shovel, rather than hands) to dig in the sand. Squashing, pinching and poking playdough, strengthening hand and finger muscles through 'Dough Disco' and 'Squiggle Whilst You Wiggle', being increasingly independent with putting on/taking off coats, wellies, waterproofs, hats, scarves and gloves and doing up buttons and zips. Making snips in paper with scissors.

**Literacy:** Phase 1 phonics taught through nursery rhymes and initial sound/oral blending games, giving meaning to marks they make, recognising their name, visiting the school and Ashton library, holding books correctly, understanding the five key concepts about print (it has meaning, it can have different purposes, names of the different parts of a book, page sequencing, reading from left to right and top to bottom). Phase 2 phonics—learning the letters—SATPIN

**Maths:** Understanding patterns and being able to recognise and create their own repeated patterns. To recognise numerals 1-3, count 3 objects with 1-1 correspondence, to be able to subitise 3 objects without counting them.

**Understanding the World:** Learning about different occupations and special people, using their senses to explore natural and manmade materials, exploring Autumn/ Winter and seasonal change, talking about what they see, caring for the natural environment through recycling and composting, exploring how things work. Learning about different celebrations such as bonfire night, remembrance day and Christmas.

**Expressive Arts and Design:** Remembering and singing entire songs, copying the pitch and melody, exploring different materials freely, in order to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make. Role playing in the home corner and small world area, creating closed shapes with continuous lines, and beginning to use these shapes to represent objects, using drawing to represent ideas like movement or loud noises, exploring colour and colour-mixing.
