Reading

Why Read?

- Children who read often and widely get better at it.
- It exercises our brains.
- 3. Improves concentration.
- 4. Teaches children about the world around them.
- 5. Improves vocabulary and leads to more highly-developed language skills.
- 6. Develops imagination.
- 7. Helps develop empathy.
- 8. A great form of entertainment.
- 9. Relaxes the body and clams the mind.
- 10. Underpins the whole curriculum.





Read daily with your child and discuss what they are reading.

Routines

Homework

Homework will be given out on a Friday and is to be completed and returned by the following Tuesday.

- Maths: Schofield and Sims Book. Every week, one page.
- **Comprehension**: fortnightly. A differentiated text and questions will be emailed to you. Complete one of the three levels only. If you are unsure which level your child is at, please ask us.
- Reading: daily. Reading underpins the whole curriculum. If you can manage just 10 minutes each day or as often as possible, it will really support your child's progress.
- *Spelling*: a sheet for practise will be sent home each week and an online quiz on Purple Mash will be available each week. This quiz replaces a test done in school.
- Times tables: your child has a login for TTRockstars to practise their time tables.
 Regular use is beneficial.

Secondary Schools

11 plus – you will get a leaflet usually at the end of April/Start of May in Year 5.

The application process is completed online.

You will need to talk to us re: extra time.

Upton, BHSA and St Anselms – apply to complete their entrance examinations through their school.

Secondary school requests are usually required by 31st October in Year 6. (2024)

You will find out allocation March 1st the following year. (2025)
