- Give suggestions to the ending of a story using the front cover, blurb and beginning to support our suggestions.
- · Review Set 1 sounds, including special friends.
- Read 1.1-1.7 green words
- Read 3 and 4 sound alien words.

As artists we will...

- Make Easter and Mothering Sunday cards
- Make a moving animal using split pins.
- · Look at a range of illustrators through the ages.
- Sing and perform a variety of songs and rhymes.

As geographers we will...

Draw maps of our local area. We will know that simple symbols are used to identify features.

- Know and retell the Easter story.
- Know about the past through story settings and characters.

As scientists we will...

- · Record using marks we can interpret and explain.
- Investigate the process of cooking using heat (making porridge).

- · Name and describe animals that live in different habitats.
