Multiplication Check 2025

- The children in Y4 will have their times tables tested formally in the Summer of 2025.
- It will take place within a two week period from Monday 1st June 2026. School will administer the test.
- Children will answer questions against the clock on an ipad, with 6 seconds to answer 25 one-mark questions.
 The test will last no longer than 5 minutes and will be marked instantly.
- · The test is to help teachers identify where the children are in their tables knowledge. There is no pass mark. Results will not be published
- but you will be informed on your child's end of year report.

Homework

KS2 Home Learning

Following on from our parent questionnaire (2024), we have listened, and made the decision as a school, to set reading and spellings homework on a weekly basis.

Year 4 will also focus on their times tables.

Termly projects

There will also be optional termly projects based on our topics for that term. Suggestions will be on the school website, on our class page.

The report is based on 114,970 responses to our <u>Annual</u> <u>Literacy Survey</u> from children and young people aged 5 to 18 in early 2025.

- Just I in 3 (32.7%) children and young people aged 8 to 18 said they enjoyed reading in 2025. This is the lowest level since we first asked the question in 2005.
- Only I in 5 (18.7%) children and young people aged 8 to 18 said that they read daily, again, the lowest levels since 2005.

Read for at least 20 minutes a day, 3-5 times a week

To help you understand what you are reading, talk with an adult in your family about your reading at least twice week.

If they ask you questions this will help you to develop your comprehension skills.

Remember to record all reading in your reading log and have your book in school every day.

We will be looking at the reading logs to choose a 'Reader of the Month'

Spelling

LSCWC (Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check) sheet sent home on a Monday. This can also be completed online which will be set as a 2do on Purple Mash

Spelling test will now be completed in school on a Friday.

The children will be able to practice this at home.

The children use the same log-in as last year.
