Read aloud accurately books that are consistent with developing phonic knowledge.
Re-read books to build up fluency and confidence in word reading

Reading Comprehension

Develop pleasure in reading and motivation to read
Link what they read or hear read to their own experiences.
Learn to appreciate rhymes and poems, and to recite some.
Recognise and join in with predictable phrases.
Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far.
Check that the text makes sense, correcting inaccurate reading.
Discuss the significance of the title and events.

Writing: Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation

Leave spaces between words

Use a capital letter for names of people and the personal pronoun 'I' Begin to punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark

Join sentences using 'and'. 'but', 'because' or 'so'.

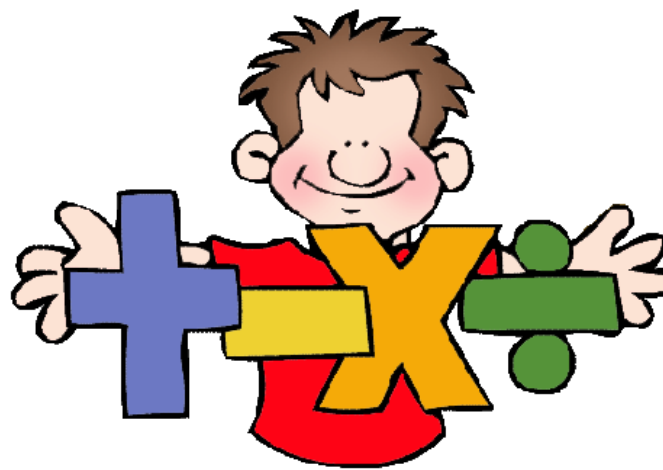

This year, there will be a strong focus on mental maths. Practising quick fire number facts at home with your child will help to improve their confidence in maths lessons.

Looking at clocks, discussing time intervals and dealing with money would also be beneficial.
