
English

Writing




Children will have the opportunity to write a variety of different texts in which they will be able to practise their grammar, composition, handwriting and spelling skills. As the year goes on, their writing will become more varied and technically advanced.

Our writing units will be linked to our history or geography topic and our class text, and cover a range of writing genres including stories, non-chronological reports, diaries, letters and information texts.

Spelling

Learning to spell words is a really important part of the Year 3 curriculum, as it moves children away from relying heavily on phonics. Each week children will be given a list of 10 new words to understand and spell, generally following spelling rules and patterns. Children are to practise reading and writing the words in a variety of different ways:

Behaviour

Children are expected to show respect to each other, to all adults and the school environment (inside the building and on the playground). We have a clear behaviour system that all the children follow. As a school we have 3 rules: be **responsible**, be **respectful** and be **safe**. Children are taught what these mean and understand there are consequences for breaking these rules. The rules and behaviour systems are clearly displayed in all classrooms and around central parts of the school.

Uniform

It's really important that your child comes into school in full school uniform, unless it is a PE day. School uniform is: grey trousers, skirt or shorts, white polo shirt and a blue school jumper.

Please can you ensure that your child's name is written clearly in all their possessions. This includes coats, jumpers, uniform and PE kit. This makes it easier if it goes missing, as then it usually finds its way back to our classroom.

PE

On your child's PE days, they will need to wear their PE kit to school. This should include a white T-shirt, black shorts/leggings/joggers and pumps/trainers for outdoor games. Children can't wear jewellery for PE and long hair must be tied back.

Children are not allowed to bring coloured or heavily logoed clothes for PE. Please help children to be organised each week with the correct kit.

Connected Curriculum

At Ravensbury, we teach history, geography, art, DT and music through our connected curriculum. Children will have the opportunity to learn about a wide range of topics and work with a music specialist teacher.

Our Topics

Autumn Term 1 – What lies beneath our feet?

Autumn Term 2 – What impact can humans have on the Earth?

Spring Term 1 – What was it like to live in Ancient Egypt?

Spring Term 2 – Where are the world's greatest waterways?

Summer Term 1 – Why were the Romans so powerful?

Summer Term 2 – What can be found by the coast?

Children are also taught Science, Computing, Spanish, PSHE and RE.

In year 3, children learn how to play the ukulele with a specialist music teacher.



Homework

Your child will be given a piece of maths homework each week which will review the learning they have already covered. They will also be given 10 spellings and a times tables to practise. These will be tested weekly. Homework will be given out on a Friday and should be returned by the following Friday morning.

If homework is not returned on Friday morning, children will have to miss their playtime to complete this.

Weekly homework

1 piece of maths

Daily reading

Daily spelling practice - they will be tested every Friday

Daily times table practice (in year 3 we practise 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10s)

If your child has access to the internet at home, they will be able to use TT Rockstars to support their maths learning.
