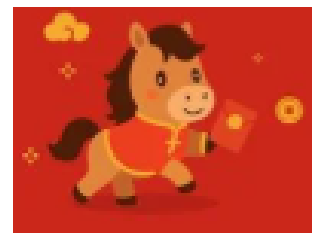
MUSICIAN OF THE MONTH - LUKE COMBS
