NEW MUSICIAN OF THE MONTH - BRAHMS



Johannes Brahms was born in 1833 in the German city of Hamburg. His father was a musician who played several instruments. and Johannes loved music, too. By the time he was six, he'd invented his own system for writing notes down on a page. Of course, he took instrument lessons, learning to play cello, horn, and piano. By the time he was ten, he was such a good pianist that he performed in public, as part of a chamber music concert. Brahms also loved books and read everything he could find including novels, poetry, and folk tales.
