What a brilliant summer term it has been for Year 1! The children have been fantastic, showing great enthusiasm, creativity, and curiosity in all areas of their learning. A real highlight of the term was our exciting trip to the Blue Planet Aquarium, where the children loved exploring and learning about the amazing underwater creatures. From graceful jellyfish to fearsome sharks, there was so much to see and discover. The children recalled amazing facts from their prior learning which amazed the Blue Planet Aquarium staff.

In Geography, Year 1 explored the world beyond their local area by comparing Shanghai to Poynton. They identified both the similarities and differences between the two places, looking closely at human and physical features. It was fantastic to see the children developing their geographical vocabulary and understanding how places can be both unique and connected. Their curiosity and insight during these lessons were truly impressive. In History, Year 1 have been learning about Grace Darling and her heroic rescue in 1838. We carried out some drama activities and news reports to help us understand what life was like for her and to record the

events of the storm. In Science, we enjoyed using our enquiry skills to find out how our bodies work including our senses.

Continuing with our theme this term of 'Oh I Do Like to Be Beside the Seaside', as part of our Art unit, the children created their own colourful tie-dye t-shirts, which they proudly wore for our Beach Day. It was a fun-filled day where the children, as part of their Design and Technology unit, also designed and made a healthy lunch, preparing tasty wraps and refreshing smoothies. Another exciting moment this term was when a mysterious suitcase appeared in the classroom. After investigating its contents, the children discovered it belonged to the boy from the story 'Lost and Found.' Inspired by this, they innovated the story, replacing the penguin with an animal character of their choice. Their story writing was incredibly creative and showcased just how much they've learned and progressed this year. Well done, Year 1 – we are so proud of all that you have achieved in this year!

The end of the year has been especially busy and exciting, filled with memorable moments, celebrations and plenty of smiles.

In English, Year 2 have been hard at work creating their own triaramas and beautifully written information texts all about owls. Using the texts *Owl Babies* and *The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark* as inspiration, the children produced incredible information texts and eye-catching triaramas filled with fascinating owl facts. They also wrote their own wonderful stories based on *The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark*, showcasing their creativity, imagination and growing confidence as writers. It's been a joy to see how much they've enjoyed this project and the pride they've taken in their work!

In Geography, Year 2 became map explorers as they investigated the town of Weymouth on the Jurassic Coast. Working in pairs, the children used Google Earth to explore the area, identifying and noting both physical and human features along the way. They showed excellent map skills and a growing understanding of different geographical features, impressing us with their curiosity and teamwork throughout the activity.

In Design and Technology, Year 2 have been busy bringing their Moving Monsters to life! The children worked hard to design and build their own monsters using linkages with levers and pivots. They then evaluated their creations against the original design criteria to see how well they met the challenge. The results were fantastic, every monster looked amazing and, most importantly, they all moved!



The children had a brilliant time mixing all of the ingredients and cooking them in groups. The end products were yummy! There are definitely some children we will be seeing on 'Bake Off' in the future. We were also able to be creative in our Art and Design sessions. We created our own planets made out of salt dough.

In Geography, we went on a fieldwork trip to our local area to identify human and physical features. We realised that on Park Lane, many of the things we could see had been built by humans as this is the main shopping street in Poynton. There was a lot of debate about how to classify some of the features of the area!

We cannot believe we are at the end of what has been such a brilliant year with such an amazing group of children. We are going to miss you all so much but we know you are ready for Year 4. We can't wait to hear about all of the brilliant things you have been learning about next year!

This half term included some very special events that helped bring our learning to life. One of the highlights was our trip to the cinema, where we had our very own screen to watch the new *How to Train Your Dragon* film. The film was fantastic and the children were absolutely captivated – it was a magical experience and a perfect way to inspire their dragon-themed writing.

We also had the amazing opportunity to take part in a live virtual lesson with the Jorvik Centre. The children were taught by a real-life Viking warrior, who shared fascinating insights into Viking life, the role of a warrior, and even showed us Viking weapons! The children asked thoughtful questions and were eager to learn more – it was a brilliant way to deepen their understanding of the topic.

Another incredible moment was a live session with none other than *Cressida Cowell*, the author of the *How to Train Your Dragon* series. She reminded the children that *anyone* can be a writer if they want to be – a powerful message that left us all feeling motivated to continue writing and imagining!


