

Year 1



What a fantastic start to the school year it has been! The children have settled brilliantly into their new routines and have shown enthusiasm and curiosity in all areas of their learning. We are so proud of how well they've adapted and the wonderful progress they've already made in just a few weeks. One of the highlights this half term was our exciting Minibeast Day! The children came to school dressed as their favourite minibeasts, from butterflies to beetles, and took part in a range of themed activities. In English, we explored the beautiful story, The Bug Collector. The children created their own minibeasts using playdough and used fantastic adjectives to describe them. They also completed their very first story retelling of *The Bug* Collector. In Maths, we have focused on building a strong understanding of place value. The children have worked hard comparing numbers using greater than and less than and using practical resources to deepen their understanding. In History, we have been learning about the incredible Wright Brothers and the invention of the first aeroplanes. The children enjoyed travelling back in time to explore what life was like in the early 1900s and how much transport has changed since then. Our DT work has linked brilliantly with our minibeast theme, as the children began designing and planning their very own bug houses – thinking carefully about how to make them safe and suitable for their chosen creatures. It has been a busy, fun-filled half term packed with learning, creativity, and new experiences. We are looking forward to even more exciting learning next half term!

Year 2



We are so proud of how all the children have settled into Year 2. They have embraced our Superhero theme with enthusiasm, creativity and teamwork, it's been a truly super start to the year! To round off the half term, we enjoyed a fantastic Superhero Day! The children took part in a series of exciting missions to help Supertato defeat the Evil Pea, showing amazing problemsolving and collaboration. A real highlight was our incredible creative session with Marc Jackson, where the children learned how to design and draw their own superhero characters for their comic books. Their costumes, imaginations and engagement were simply amazing; it was a truly immersive experience!

In English, the children have been inspired by our stimulus text 'Eliot Jones: the Midnight Superhero'. They have written beautifully detailed superhero stories, filled with action, adventure and creativity; we have been blown away by their ideas! In Science, our young scientists have been helping Traction Man on his Material Missions! One of their challenges was to create their own paper to help him record the movements of the 'mysterious toes', a brilliant mix of fun and investigation! In History, the children have been captivated by our study of the Titanic disaster. They've been gathering evidence, exploring different perspectives and debating a big question: Who was really to blame? Our young historians are doing a fantastic job as they prepare to deliver their verdict soon!

It's been a half term full of excitement, creativity and discovery. We are so proud of our Year 2 superheroes!



Year 3



As we come to the end of a busy and exciting first half of the Autumn Term, we wanted to take a moment to celebrate all that Year 3 have achieved so far. The children have settled into Key Stage 2 brilliantly and should be very proud of the fantastic learning they've done over the past few weeks!


The children had a fantastic Pirate Day, which really brought our theme to life! The children looked brilliant in their pirate costumes and took part in a range of exciting activities, including a Maths-based treasure hunt, pirate-themed games, as well as writing their own pirate sea shanty inspired by 'John Kanaka'!

In English, the children have been inspired by our stimulus texts 'The Pirate Cruncher', 'The Pirates Next Door' and 'The Pirates of Scurvy Sands', written by Jonny Duddle. During this time, the children have planned, written and edited their own pirate adventure stories, ensuring the use of exciting vocabulary and story structure to engage their readers. As part of our English lessons, the children have been learning the difference between formal and informal letters; we had great fun writing to Jonny Duddle! The children thought carefully about language, layout, and tone. They really enjoyed the chance to communicate with a real author — fingers crossed we might even get a reply!


At the start of this term in Maths, we focused on place value, helping children to understand the value of each digit in 2- and 3-digit numbers. Using practical equipment and visual models, we explored how to partition numbers into hundreds, tens and ones, and how to compare and

order them. We then moved onto more formal methods for addition and subtraction, using the compact column method, and the children developed their confidence with written calculations of up to three-digit numbers.

In Art and Design, we've been exploring the work of Jamie Swim, whose colourful and abstract art has inspired some wonderful creativity. The children have experimented with shape, colour and texture to create their own bold and imaginative pieces based on exotic sea landscapes in Hawaii.



Year 4



What an incredible first half term it has been for Year 4! We are so proud of how the children have settled back into school life and the effort, enthusiasm and positivity they have shown in everything they do. From the very first week, the class have impressed us with their excellent attitude towards learning and their growing independence. It's been a real pleasure to see them supporting one another, working collaboratively and showing such kindness and respect in the classroom and around school.

One area where the children have made particularly impressive progress is in their times tables. Everyone has been working exceptionally hard to improve their speed and accuracy, showing real determination and resilience. We are seeing fantastic improvements across the classes — those daily practices are clearly paying off! It is wonderful to see how much pride the children are taking in their achievements in Maths, and how they are challenging themselves to reach the next level.

Across the curriculum, the children have made huge strides. In English, they have been developing their writing skills beautifully, using ambitious vocabulary and creative ideas to bring their writing to life. In Science, they have shown curiosity and investigative thinking, asking

thoughtful questions and sharing their discoveries with enthusiasm. It has been brilliant to see how much they are enjoying their learning and how eager they are to explore new topics.

Our Ancient Egypt theme has been a real highlight this term. The children have shown wonderful enthusiasm for this theme, becoming Egyptologists as they discovered all about the fascinating world of pharaohs, pyramids and mummies! They were particularly captivated by the story of Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, and their curiosity and excitement during our lessons have been infectious.

A special mention must go to the children for their exemplary behaviour and enthusiasm on our visit to Macclesfield Museum. The staff there were blown away by the children's amazing knowledge, insightful questions and respectful attitude throughout the day. They represented our school brilliantly and made us all incredibly proud.

Well done, Year 4, on such a fantastic start to the year. You have shown hard work, enthusiasm, and a real love of learning in everything you do. Enjoy a well-deserved rest over the half-term break — we cannot wait to see what exciting things the next half term will bring!



It's been a *fantastic* and *inspiring* half term for our hardworking Year 6 pupils! They have packed so much learning, creativity and adventure into the past few weeks, and we are so proud of their enthusiasm and effort.

One of the highlights was an art trip to Lyme Park, where pupils took inspiration from the incredible work of local artist Rob Wilson. With sketchbooks and cameras in hand, they explored the grounds, capturing the beauty of Lyme Hall, the Cage, and the rolling landscapes all around. Back at school, they've been busy transforming their sketches into stunning mixed-media artwork in Rob Wilson's distinctive style. The results are truly impressive — full of colour, texture and imagination.

As well as their artistic adventures, Year 6 have been brilliant young geographers! On their geography fieldtrip around Poynton, they compared densely and sparsely populated areas, investigating differences in pollution, noise levels and residents' views. Using maps, measuring equipment and interviews, they discovered that busier areas often had higher noise and pollution levels, while quieter spots were calmer and cleaner — although some residents said they enjoyed the energy of living closer to the centre.

To top-off an already amazing few weeks, some lucky Year 6 pupils also had the incredible opportunity to visit the Houses of Parliament in London. They learned all about how laws are

made and were even able to watch a real discussion of a Bill in the House of Lords! It was a truly unforgettable experience that brought their learning about democracy and government to life.

From Art and Geography to Politics and Citizenship, Year 6 have shown determination, curiosity and creativity in everything they've done. They have worked so hard this half term, and it is amazing to see just how much they have achieved already.
