



As readers, we will apply the skill of blending phonemes in order to read words, and read red words that do not conform to regular phonic patterns accurately so we can decode In RE, we will be thinking

Christmas-Why do we give and receive qufts?

As mathematicians, we will cover:

- place value to 10, followed by place
- Addition and subtraction to 10 followed by addition and subtraction to 20.

As geographers, we will use fieldwork and observation to explore the local geography of Bunbury and its surrounding areas. We will discuss the countries, cities and features that make up the United Kingdom and begin to identify hot and cold places around the world.

As computer scientists, we will discuss the importance of keeping information, such as our usernames and passwords, private and actively demonstrate this in lessons. We will take ownership of our work and save this in our own private space such as the My Work folder on Purple Mash.



HOMEWORK



Each child will receive a reading diary and homework journal in order to complete homework tasks.

Reading – daily reading is given a high priority from reception to year 6. Children across the school will be expected to read at least 5 times per week. Reading entries will be recorded in a reading diary which all the children will be provided with. Each half term, class teachers will also issue a list of recommended reading both fiction and non-fiction linked to the connected curriculum theme.

Spelling – Children will receive a spelling list of age-appropriate high frequency words at the start of each term to learn. Using our booklet 'Helping your child to spell' the children need to work on learning around 6 words per week.
 MyMaths – Children will receive a weekly online maths task related to learning which has taken place that week in school

Home learning projects – As part of our inclusive connected curriculum, all classes will be asked to complete a home learning project **once a half term**. These projects, Take away homework, are linked to the class learning theme and children have a choice of which task they wish to complete at home. We believe that these projects are a great opportunity for parents/carers to work alongside their child, enhancing their learning experience. The projects are shared and celebrated with other classes.

<u>Knowledge organiser</u> – Key facts, information and vocabulary linked to the area of learning in class for that term. Children will be expected to know some of the facts and use these key words within their learning.

MATHS

MyMaths is an interactive online teaching and homework subscription website for schools that builds pupil engagement and consolidates maths knowledge. It has lessons and tasks to work through which provide step-by-step explanations to break down the lesson content into bite-sized pieces. This will help children to recap a concept and also help you, as parents/carers, to understand the method taught. There are also games to complete.



There are also maths parent guides which have been uploaded onto each year group's class page. This document provides calculation method examples.

READING

- Reading is taught in a Read Write Inc group (like in Reception).
- These groups are fluid and all children are regularly assessed to
 determine which colour books they work on. While a child may be able to
 decode the words with ease, we also look for fluency and comprehension
 when assessing if they are ready to move on.
- A label will go in reading records weekly stating how many times a child has read with an adult as we cannot write in each individual record during these reading lessons.
- All books and reading records need to come back to school on a Monday
 and all children will bring home their new books on a Wednesday.

PHONIC SCREENING

In June 2026, year 1 children nationally will complete a Phonics Screening Check. This is designed to confirm whether pupils have learnt phonic decoding to an appropriate standard. The check consists of 20 real words and 20 'nonsense-words' that pupils read aloud. A nonsense word is a fake word that's used soley to test a child's ability to use phonics and whether they can correctly pronouce the word.

If a child does not reach the 'pass mark' (released by the government later in June) then they will receive additional decoding support and resit the check in year 2.

PE KITS



- Children need to come to school in their PE kit
- PE is on the following days: Wednesday and Friday.

- Plain black track suit, black shorts or skort, green polo shirt and black canvas pumps/trainers in line with the new uniform, PE black hooded sweatshirt.




If there is anything you would like to talk to us about, no matter how small it may seem, please do!
