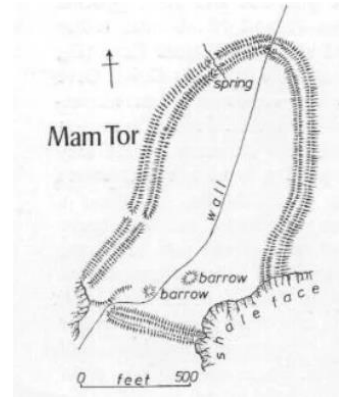


Magnificent Mam Tor

Neolithic Period	an archaeological period, the final division of the Stone Age in Europe, Asia and Africa.

Blue John Cavern	a series of caverns considered to be the finest range in Great Britain
Mam Tor	Mam Tor is a 517 m (1,696 ft) hill near Castleton
mountains	large natural elevation of the earth's surface rising abruptly from the surrounding level
hills	a naturally raised area of land, not as high or craggy as a mountain
topographical	relating to the arrangement or accurate representation of the physical features of an area.
Iron Age	a prehistoric period that followed the Bronze Age when tools were made of iron
