Dear Parents and carers

What a fantastic first week we have had back in school. I hope you all had a fantastic holiday with family and friends and are well rested ready for the term ahead. It is always a busy one as we move closer to Christmas in school.

This week:

On Wednesday 5th November our year 6 pupils embarked on a deeply moving and educational visit to Kelsall Methodist Chapel to take part in the Remembrance Hope Journey. Run by volunteers, this special event offered our children a unique opportunity to connect with the past, reflect on the sacrifices made during wartime, and understand the importance of remembrance in our community.

One of the most poignant moments of the visit was a conversation with a local resident who was just 8 years old when the second world war broke out. She spoke with warmth and clarity about her childhood experiences. The children listed intently as she described the arrival of evacuees to Kelsall.

The week culminated in a moving Service of Remembrance on Friday 7th November, where we were

honoured to welcome representatives from the Royal British Legion, Rev Tim as well as parents and carers.

Our Year 6 pupils read poems and the roll of honour was shared with great reverence. The children marked the two minute silence with exemplary behaviour, showing deep respect and maturity throughout the whole service.







Friday 14th November

There are a couple of events taking place in school on Friday 14th November that we'd like to draw your attention to.

Firstly, we will be supporting Children in Need. Children are invited to come to school in their own clothes, and we kindly ask for a small donation of your choice to support this wonderful charity. We understand that this is an expensive time of year, so please feel free to donate whatever you feel comfortable with—every contribution is appreciated.

Secondly, we have a school disco organised by Friends Of Bunbury taking place that evening:

To book your child's place please complete payment and give permission for them to attend via School Money by Wednesday 12th November.

EYFS and KS1 children will go straight into the disco from school, so they are welcome to wear their disco clothes during the day. Alternatively, as it is a glow disco, they may wear a white t-shirt under their jumper, which can be revealed later. This helps avoid the need for changing at school and reduces the risk of clothing being misplaced.

KS2 children will be going home between school and the disco, so they do not need to wear disco outfits during the school day just own clothes of their choice.

Please collect all children from the front of the school when their disco finishes. Children will only be handed over once parents/carers are identified.

Curriculum

You may have seen recent news about changes to the national curriculum. These will not come into effect until Spring 2027, with full implementation from September 2028. One of the key shifts is a renewed focus on the fundamentals in the early years—particularly in EYFS and Key Stage 1. Core areas such as reading, transcription (handwriting) and early mathematics will be central to building strong foundations for learning. At Bunbury, we are already taking proactive steps to align with this direction. This September, we introduced the First 4 Maths Academy scheme to strengthen mathematical understanding, alongside a renewed emphasis on letter formation



and handwriting to support spelling across all age groups. We are also continuing to develop our inclusive practices, ensuring every child can thrive. As always, we remain committed to providing the very best education for our pupils and preparing them for the future of learning.

Attendance

I continue to receive a number of requests for absences. We'd like to remind all families of the importance of regular school attendance.

Regular attendance at school is not only essential for your child's academic progress and social/emotional reasons, it is also a legal requirement. Whilst we understand that pupils will be absent from time to time due to illness; absence from school for other reasons should only be for exceptional circumstances. **We would like to remind all parents and carers that holidays taken during term time are not authorised unless there are *exceptional circumstances***. These may include serious illness or bereavement of a close family member, or a parent returning from military service. Family holidays, birthdays, or travel due to cost or convenience do not meet the criteria for exceptional set by the Department for Education. Holidays taken in term time will be subject to a fine.

Regular attendance is essential for your child's learning and development, and unauthorised absences which lead to persistent absence may also result in a fixed penalty notice. Attendance less than 90% is classified as persistent. We appreciate your support in ensuring your child attends school consistently and benefits fully from their education.

Parking

I have received several concerns this week regarding unsafe and inconsiderate parking around the school site, including vehicles blocking residents' driveways, obstructing pedestrian pathways, and creating hazards when crossing roads. Please can I kindly remind all parents and carers to park safely and respectfully when dropping off or collecting children. Let's work together to ensure our school community remains a safe and welcoming environment for everyone — including our neighbours and pedestrians. Thank you for your continued support.
