#### **Language:**

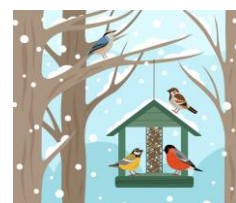
In Language, we are developing an awareness of capital letters and full stops in our writing as well as recognising other punctuation marks in our class texts.
