aerial view	A view from above.
farm	An area of land used to produce crops or to breed animals and livestock.
house	A building designed for people to live in.

physical geography	Natural features of land.
river	A large, natural stream of fresh water that flows into the sea or a lake.

town	A large group of houses , shops and buildings where people live and work. Towns are larger than villages but smaller than cities. Carnforth is a town .
train station	A place on a railway line where trains stop for people to get on and off trains.
village	A small group of houses , perhaps with a few shops, that are often in the countryside. Warton is a village .

Top 5 Facts

1. Carnforth is a small town near Lancaster in Lancashire. It also forms part of the City of Lancaster.
2. Located 5 miles from Lancaster and Morecambe.
3. Situated at the North East of Morecambe Bay.
4. The West Coast Main Line and River Keir runs through Carnforth.
5. The Railway and Iron Works were a very important part of Carnforth's history. It grew from a small village to a railway town when it became part of three railway junctions.

Carnforth Train Station

- Carnforth Railway Station was opened in 1846 by the Lancaster and Carlisle Railway Company and was originally just a single platform.
- In 1856, a small station was built following the connection of the Furness and Midland Railway lines.
- The station was completely rebuilt in 1937. Carnforth developed into a bustling junction linking stations across the North West. During the two World Wars thousands of servicemen passed through Carnforth Station en route to duty overseas.
- The mainline platforms were closed down and removed in 1970 prior to electrification of the West Coast Main Line. Carnforth was then reduced to a branch station.
