Chariot- a two wheeled card pulled by horses used for racing a riding into battle.

Claudius – Roman Emperor 41-54AD who extended Roman Empire into Britain.

Emperor- the leader of an empire

Fort -a fortified building in a strategic position.

Groma – a wooden cross with weights used to make the roads straight.

Hadrian—Roman Emperor 117-138AD secured borders and ordered the build of a wall

Invasion- to enter as an enemy, by force, to take control.

Latin- he language spoken and written by the Romans.

Mosaic- a pattern made from coloured pieces of stones and pottery.

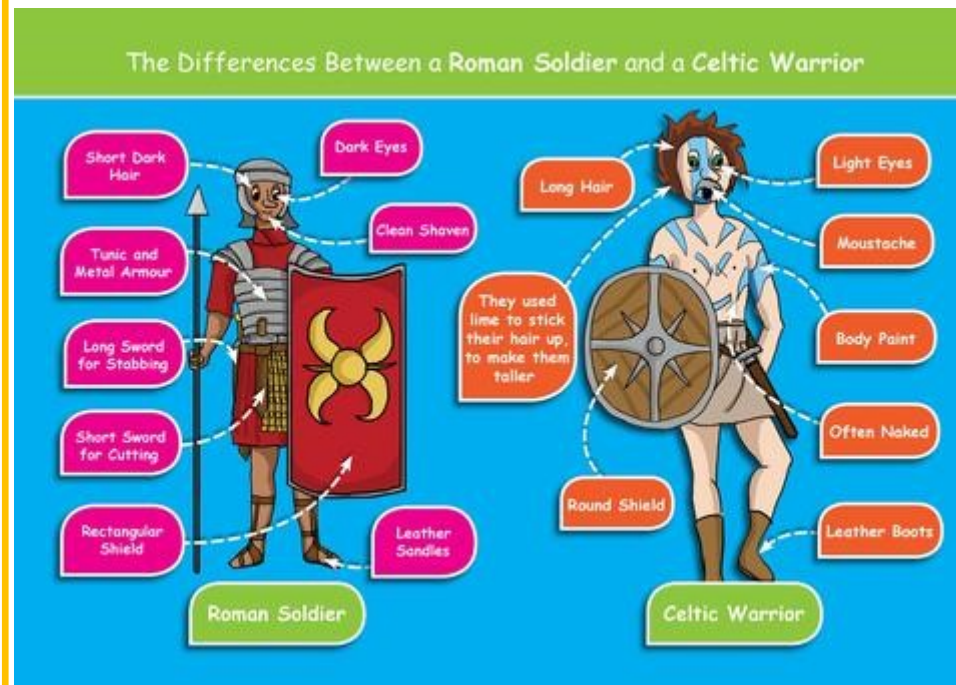
Roman facts and figures:
