### Wonderful Words to learn and use:

**Acropolis**—an ancient citadel located above the city of Athens.

**Architecture**—the art and science of designing and creating buildings.

**Artistotle**—an ancient Greek philosopher.

**Athens**—the largest most powerful state where democracy was born.

**Citizen**—someone who lives in a particular area or belongs to a country.

**Column**—an upright, cylindrical pillar supporting an arch or structure.

**Democracy**— a form of government where citizens make decisions are made on how they are ruled and what laws to use.

**Homer**—was a Greek poet who wrote 2 famous Greek literature poems

**Government**—a group of people with the authority to govern a country or state.

**Gods/goddesses**—a supernatural being who is worshipped due to their authority.

**Marathon**—a town in Greece and the site of the Battle of Marathon in 490BC

**Olympics**— a series of athletic challenges that takes place every four years

**Parthenon**—a temple that dominates the Acropolis in Athens

**Plato**—famous Greek who believed men and women had the same intellectual powers.

**Sophocles**—an ancient Greek dramatis who wrote over 100 plays.

**Socrates**—a wise man from Ancient Greece



The ancient Greeks can be credit with many inventions and discoveries. They invented government, democracy, the Olympics and practised early medicine.

Ancient Greece is sometimes referred to as the birthplace of civilisation. It is made up of three periods. The Ancient Greeks have influenced politics, art, architecture, sculpture, science, philosophy and literature today.

Men had a much better life than women. Only men were involved in government and allowed to compete in the Olympic Games. Women stayed at home and were expected to make clothes and have children.
