Class 1 were visited by the Fire service on Wednesday, as part of their People Who Help Us theme. They brought their Fire and Rescue vehicle to the school car park and everyone got a turn at trying on the helmet, wearing the uniform and sitting in the van. The children learnt about what the Fire service do for a job and asked lots of questions.





We have spent October learning all about the lives of some inspirational icons - as part of our celebration of Black History Month. We have thought about how hard it was to be a black person in parts of America in the 1950s and 1960s and how some amazing people stood up for their rights and rose to the top in their professions. Children should be able to tell you all about the athlete Jesse Owens and the pioneering Headteacher, Betty Campbell. They should also be able to talk about space heroes, Mae Jemison and Katherine Johnson and Civil Rights icon Rosa Parks. Learning about these people helps us to understand the lives of others and shines a spotlight on some incredible motivated people. Understanding our diverse world helps us get a greater idea of our place in society.
