A few reminders



As you know it is important to encourage good, healthy habits among our children. Therefore we wanted to remind you of a few things around snacks and drinks at school.

Water bottles are vital to keep the children hydrated. In line with local policy, and following dental good practice, the children should only have water in their bottles - not juice. Juice is provided with school lunches and also at after school club, alongside food. This is what dentists recommend. Staff may stop a child drinking juice if it is in their bottle and water will be provided instead. Water bottles are always available when children need them (even if your child comes home and tells you different)

Snacks at breaktime are a great way of stopping any hunger pangs before lunch. The only snacks children are allowed in school are fruit or vegetables. Children in Class 1 and 2 are given fruit. Please do not send in biscuits, bars or other snacks as these are not permitted and children won't be allowed to eat them.

This is in line with other local schools and Lancashire healthy eating advice. We thank you for your help with this.
