Goostrey Community Primary school has been twinned with Elizabethfontein Primary school in South Africa for twenty-one years. The relationship has been of huge benefit to both schools and our associated communities.

Elizabethfontein school is located in an isolated rural area in the Cederberg region approximately 3½ hours' drive north of Cape Town. Almost all of the children come from poor farmworkers' families and many of them have poverty related problems e.g. low self esteem, low aspiration, little family support, and quite a large number of the children suffer from foetal alcohol syndrome caused by alcoholic mothers during pregnancy.

Although the two schools are very different in terms of location, the ethos and character of both are very similar. Elizabethfontein's key principles of love, respect, kindness, friendship and honesty are displayed at Goostrey school for all to see. Their motto is *Reach for the stars*, and children are encouraged to '*Enter to learn*' and '*Leave to serve*'.

Below is part of an address that Andrea Swarts (who came to Goostrey in 2005 on the first visit) delivered to a teacher's conference in South Africa recently:

I grew up on a farm with my family and attended Elizabethfontein Primer. I had the honour of serving as Head girl in grade 7 – an experience that taught me leadership, responsibility, and the value of serving others.

During 2005 when I was in grade 5, I was chosen as one of a group of learners who had the privilege of travelling to England to visit GCPS. What an amazing experience we had! The adventure opened our eyes to the world. While in England we were welcomed into homes with incredible warmth and kindness. The hospitality of the families we stayed with made us feel at home and showed us generosity beyond measure and taught us the value of caring for others. The experience built lifelong memories.

One of the highlights of the trip was performing dances at Goostrey Rose Day festival. One of my personal favourites was a hiphop dance to the song 'I believe I can'. I was the lead dancer of the routine. The words of the song are powerful – they remind us that if we believe in ourselves we can achieve great things and rise above any challenge.

I realise that this was Miss Kotze's dream for us and that she chose that song for a reason. Performing that dance, feeling the rhythm and singing in my heart reminded me that dreams are possible and that belief, courage and hard work can truly take you far.

I rerturned to Elizabethfontein School 4 years ago, starting as an Education Assistant after the very same Miss Kotze offered me the opportunity. Returning to the school as a staff member has been one of the greatest blessings of my life. I have had the chance to grow, to help shape little minds and bodies and to stand alongside teachers who made a real difference in my life and are still continuing to do so. I teach the little ones the same dance to the song 'I believe I can' – that I danced to at Roseday all those years ago.

So, this year is also my final year studying to become a professional teacher – I am the first in my family to obtain a degree. So to everyone in the England community, thank you for opening doors that changed my life forever. Because of you all I have been able to reach my dream of becoming a teacher.

The children at Elizabethfontein have a particular reputation for their wonderful dancing and they will perform at Goostrey Rose Day and at other events during their visit.

We are inviting eight children and two teachers from Elizabethfontein to Goostrey in the summer of 2026. All flights and UK costs are covered by individuals and groups within the Goostrey community.

Frequently asked questions about holiday requests in term time.

Am I entitled to take my child out of school for a family holiday?

No. Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school or the alternative provision on a regular basis

The Education Act 1996 makes it a criminal offence for a parent to "fail to secure their child's regular attendance at the school"

The School Attendance (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2024 make clear that Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances

The Head Teacher and Governing Board will determine what the exceptional circumstances are

If we decide to take a holiday during term time what should we do?

☐ The parent/carer with whom the child resides must apply in writing to the school

☐ The letter/application must explain the exceptional circumstance surrounding the request for the leave of absence

What will the school do then?

□ The Head Teacher will determine whether the exceptional circumstance ruling applies, if not the application will be declined

- o Only the Headteacher (or the Deputy) has the power to approve leave of absence applications. When making the decision the protocols and criteria laid down in the school's attendance policy must be followed.
- o Each academic year, schools inform parents/carers via a letter, newsletter or some other communication; that they may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice if their child has unauthorised absences in term time
- ☐ You will receive a written response from the Headteacher (or the Deputy) letting you know if your application has been approved
- ☐ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded as unauthorised

Penalty Notices will be issued for Term time leave:

Penalty Notice fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days.

10 Sessions of Unauthorised absence in a rolling 10 week period: A Penalty Notices may be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absences in a 10 week period. However, we retain the discretion to issue a Penalty Notice before the threshold is met. For example, where parents are deliberately avoiding the national threshold by taking several term time holidays below the above thresholds.

Per Parent/Per Child

Penalty Notice fines will continue to be issued per parent per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular school attendance the fine will be charged at: £160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days of the issue, reducing to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

(Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

Second Offence

Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first penalty notice, for either term time leave or irregular attendance the second penalty notice will be charged at:

£160 if paid within 28 days. (Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution)

Third Offence

On the third time that an offence is committed within 3 years of the first penalty notice for either a term time leave or irregular attendance a penalty notice will not be issued. The case may proceed to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'Failure to send a child to school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to £1000 or legal proceedings under Section444 (1a) can include a fine of up to £2500

IF A FAMILY GOES ON HOLIDAY IN TERM TIME SCHOOL WILL NOT PROVIDE ANY WORK FOR THE PUPILS. TIME OUT OF SCHOOL, FOR A HOLIDAY WILL RESULT IN THE CHILD/REN MISSING TEACHING AND LEARNING AND THEY MAY FIND IT CHALLENGING TO CATCH UP WITH THEIR PEERS ON THEIR RETURN.

Do you have a concern about a child?

Anyone can make a call if they have concerns about a child. This call can be made confidentially.

Cheshire East Consultation Service

The Cheshire East Consultation Service (ChECS) is the 'front door' for access to services, support and advice for children and their families.

General public

Phone ChECS on **0300 123 5012 (option 3)** Callers will be directed to a Unit Coordinator who will ask if the concerns are early help or safeguarding. You will then be directed to either Practitioner Support Officer for Early Help requests for support or a Social Worker (ChECS) for safeguarding concerns. The worker will gather your information and advise you of the next steps.

If you need to contact someone out of hours and you believe it to be an emergency that can't wait, please call our Emergency Duty Team on **0300 123 5022**.


The responsibility to get permission for other people's children to be on photographs lies with the sender not with the school.
