EYFS Curriculum Intent:

- Following personal interests and individual needs allows us to plan and provide opportunities throughout our EYFS curriculum to support learning and development and achieve a child's next steps.

Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning

Playing and Exploring

Children investigate and experience things and 'have a go'

- Realise their actions have an effect on the world.
- Plan and think ahead.
- Guide their own thinking and actions.
- Make independent choices.
- Bring their own interests and fascinations into school.
- Respond to new experiences.

Active Learning

Children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties and enjoy achievements

- Participate in routines.
- Begin to predict sequences based on routines.
- Show goal-directed behaviour.
- Begin to correct their mistakes themselves.
- Keep on trying when things are difficult.

Creating and Thinking Critically

Children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas and develop strategies for doing things

- Take part in simple pretend play.
- Sort materials.
- Review their progress as they try to achieve a goal.
- Solve real problems.
- Use pretend play to think beyond the 'here and now' and to understand another perspective.
- Feel confident about coming up with their own ideas.
- Make more links between those ideas.
- Concentrate on achieving something control their attention and ignore distractions.
