Smartphone proposals



Lost Property


Our Lost Property Officers have been incredibly busy this week, matching up named clothing with their owners, however we have an abundance of unnamed clothing left over!


A table has been placed outside of the School Office today – if your child has recently lost anything, please check through and reclaim what's yours.






We are really enjoying reading The Iron Man by Ted Hughes. We have learnt lots of new vocabulary from this text.





Wobbly Welcomers


