This half term has been very busy and we have much to celebrate from the first eight weeks of this school term.

Our Reception children and children who have joined us from other schools have settled in so well. We are very proud of our youngest learners who have adapted to school life with such confidence. They have made a flying start!

Pupils have shown great enthusiasm, perseverance and motivation since returning in September. I hope that those families who attended Parents' Evening were pleased to see their children's books.

Other celebrations this half term include the success of the autumn fair which raised over two thousand pounds for our school, our clubs starting again and the introduction of our Why Don't You..? workshops, to promote children learning new skills to do in their free time.

Our friends at All Saints' Church are holding a Halloween party with a difference on the evening of Saturday 1st November.


The party is absolutely free of charge for children between ages 4-11 and you can reserve your child's place by scanning the QR code below.
















In Year 6, we are busy from the minute we walk through the door in the morning until we leave at the end of the day. It's always go, go, go!



School Photographs

On the day, please ensure that your child is wearing full uniform, including school jumper or cardigan. If your child has Forest School or PE, please send their kit in a bag to change into.



PUNCTUALITY MATTERS

We are keen to explore how we can offer more help to families where punctuality causes stress.

If you would like to discuss how school may support, please contact Mrs Williamson, our Attendance Officer, or Mrs Robertson, our Learning Mentor.

Some of the ways we can help include developing reward charts to support children's organisation in the morning and, for example, bedtime routines.



If your child has arrived after the gates have closed, please accompany them to the school office. If they arrive after 9am, we may ask the reason for them arriving late. Please do not be offended. Our rationale for asking is so that we can think about how we can develop our approaches in school to help children and their families.

Punctuality Codes

We use two main codes to show punctuality. These are the U Code and the L Code.

The L Code is used when children arrive between 9-9.19am. This is shown as an L on the child's attendance record to show that they arrived after registers have closed. The L code does not reduce the child's overall percentage. When children arrive after 8.50am when gates are closed, they come into school via the main door by the office.

The U Code is used from 9.20am. The U code does affect the child's overall attendance percentage. The overall percentage is reduced by the U code which indicates that a child has arrived significantly after registers have closed.

In the same way that we track attendance on a daily, weekly and half termly basis, L and U codes are also reviewed to ensure that we are doing all we can to support children to attend on time.

Medical Appointments

We appreciate that medical appointments are often issued with no flexibility on the time families are given. We understand that this is particularly the case where children have hospital or specialist appointments.

If your child has a medical or dental appointment, if they come into school beforehand, they are marked as present and then the parent/carers signs them out. This does not affect their overall attendance percentage.

Where a child has a medical appointment at, for example, 9.30am and does not come into school beforehand, the M Code is recorded. This means that the child's overall attendance is reduced.

We have been very kindly gifted a school season ticket for Cheshire Phoenix Basketball matches.


