This dance form is like telling stories with your whole body and Ruhanni demonstrated to us how the hand gestures have special meanings and how the footwork, enhanced by ankle bells called ghungroos, creates rhythmic patterns which match the music.

We are so fortunate that our school family comprises of so many languages, cultures and talented children!

Seven children from year 3 to 6 visited The Hospice of the Good Shepherd, in Backford on Tuesday.

We met a lovely lady called Samantha in the lovely Multicultural room, which was decorated with symbols and writings of many faiths. Sam is the fundraising organizer for the Hospice and we heard from her that £350,000 is the target she has to raise this year to contribute to £4.6 million needed annually.

Sam told us all about the history and purpose of the Hospice and why it is needed today. We heard how the Hospice supports those who have an illness that doesn't have a cure including cancer, MND and dementia.

As we walked around the Hospice, we were struck by how carefully it was decorated and how homely and friendly it felt. The children loved the sitting room near the conservatory and garden courtyard. If we had more time, we may have tried one of the games there were to play!

We were taken to a beautiful room in The Living Well suite where the nurse explained how people are given aromatherapy massages, reflexology and other well-being treatments to support them as they care for others and themselves. The fundraising manager, Justin, introduced us to the Hospice doctor who talked about how she prescribes medicine to help patients but also activities to support people in both mind and body as they are cared for. We found out that at the Hospice people can have their pets to visit and once there was even a horse that visited through the patio doors for a lady who had missed all her pets during Covid!

Mrs Inns was very proud to take the children to the Hospice in the school mini bus. They displayed many of our school values as they listened carefully to the different guides and our hosts. They were enthusiastic and curious asking responsible questions as they heard of the need for the Hospice to support those who have life limiting illness. They were thoughtful and it was lovely on the way home in the bus to hear them discussing possible ways our school could help to raise some of the needed funds over the next few months. We are looking forward to hosting a reindeer fun run to raise money for this special place. Look out for the posters - more information will be shared in Assembly in December!
