We will be raising funds for the Hospice of the Good Shepherd.





We have been very kindly gifted a school season ticket for Cheshire Phoenix Basketball matches.



Our **Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 Christmas Services** will take place at All Saints' Church on Hoole Road.

Doors will open at 1.40pm for parents and carers and the services will start at 1.45pm. The services will end at approximately 2.30pm and children will walk back to school. All children will return to school and we are unable to accommodate requests to take children home directly from the church. All children will have been left a Christmas treat by Santa's Elves! This will be waiting for them back at school. On returning to school, children will collect their belongings and leave school from the usual gate.

Our **Reception Nativity** will take place in the School Hall at 10am on Thursday 11th December. Due to space restrictions, a maximum of 2 people per child will be able to attend. Tickets have already been distributed to Reception families.

If there is anyone who is not able to attend the nativity, please let the School Office know so we can pass your tickets to anyone who would like to bring additional family members.

PTA Christmas Discos

The two discos will be next week, on Wednesday 10th December in the School Hall. The Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 Disco will take place between 3.45pm and 5pm and the Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 Disco will take place between 5pm and 6.15pm.

Tickets for the disco cost £5. This will include a drink and a small snack and all dietary requirements will be fully catered for. Registration and tickets for the discos, plus preorders for glow wands and sweet cones, can be made on School Spider. Register your child under the Surveys and Forms tab, and make your payment(s) via the Bookings and Payments tab.

There will also be a stall selling sweets and glow wands on the day. Any pre-orders can be collected at the table outside the disco.

Children should be collected after school as normal and return to school in their party clothes. at the start time of their disco.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 Disco:

Entry to school is via the External Hall Door (by the play-park). Please wait outside the door at 3.45pm. At the end of the disco, please ensure that your child is collected promptly at 5pm from the same door (External Hall Door).

Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 Disco

Entry to school is via the School Office Door. Please wait outside the door at 5pm. At the end of the disco, please ensure that your child is collected promptly at 6.15pm from the External Hall Door (by the play-park).

HETTY at the Disco

HETTY Afterschool Club will be held in the Year 6 classrooms during the discos. If your child is booked into HETTY After-school Club, your child should go straight there at home time with their change of clothes. HETTY staff will help children get changed for the disco and take them to the disco.

After the first disco finishes at 5pm, your child will be taken back to HETTY, where they are welcome to stay for the rest of the HETTY session as usual up until 5.45pm. Collection of children will be from the School Office door. Please call 07307870845 to let the HETTY staff know you are ready to collect your child.

If you would like to collect your child straight after the first disco, please come to HETTY first to collect their bags and belongings.

As the second disco finishes at 6.15pm and HETTY closes at 5.45pm, HETTY staff will sign the children out at 5.00pm once they have been handed over to disco volunteers. Their school bags and coats will be stored at the school office/foyer area. You should collect children from the External Hall door at 6.15pm when the disco finishes. Your children will need to remember to collect their bags from the School Office/foyer area before going home.

Clubs During the School Disco's


Streetdance Club will be held in 4JK's classroom. Children can be collected from the School Office door after the club rather than the gate.




