History

Great Fire of London

- Know the fire started in a bakery in Pudding Lane on September 2nd 1666
- Know the fire spread quickly because the weather had been very dry and the houses were made of wood and built very close together
- Know Samuel Pepys wrote in his diary about the events of the Great Fire
- Know the fire burned for 4 days. As the wind died down and changed direction the fire became under control and was finally put out
- Know 6 people died in the fire, 13,200 houses were destroyed and 70,000 people were left homeless. Many left London to live elsewhere and some slept in tents

Florence Nightingale

- Know Florence Nightingale was born in Florence, Italy on 12th May 1820
- Know Florence Nightingale worked as a nurse during the Crimean War and helped improve the conditions of hospitals
- Know that hospitals during the Crimean War were very dirty and unhygienic
- Know Florence Nightingale met Queen Victoria and was awarded the Royal Red Cross
- Know that Florence Nightingale died in 1910

- Find $\frac{2}{3}$, $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$ of shapes, objects and amounts

Computing

Internet

- Know that the Internet can be useful for research
- Know that searching on the internet requires precise key word searches
- Know the name of a child friendly search engine. E.g. kiddle
- Know what to do if concerned about online content

Religious Education

How do Muslims worship?

- Muslims worship Allah who has 99 Names
- The place for prayer must be clean so prayer mats are used at home
- Muslims prepare for prayer by covering their head in different ways
- Muslims use prayer beads to help them recite and focus on 99 names of Allah
- Muslims recite the Shahadah to declare Allah is God

How do symbols help Christians understand the Easter story?

- Christians worship God in church and at home using the symbols, such as the cross to help them
- Christians believe that people need to be rescued or saved, this is called Salvation
- Christians believe Jesus died on the cross to make a way back to God
- Christians believe The Easter Story is the most important festival in the Christian calendar because it reminds them that Jesus rose again hope
- Many people celebrate Easter without believing in God, they enjoy eggs and the season of Spring

Science

Animals including humans – basic needs

- Know about similarities and differences in relation to living things
- Make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur and talk about changes
- Know that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults
- Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food, air)
- Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene

Materials – Everyday materials and comparison

- Know that all objects are made of one or more materials that are chosen specifically because they have suitable properties for the task. For example, a water bottle is made of plastic because it is transparent allowing you to see the drink inside and waterproof so that it holds the water
- Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for certain uses
- Know that when choosing what to make an object from, the properties needed are compared with the properties of the possible materials, identified through simple tests and classifying activities
- Know that a material can be suitable for different purposes and an object can be made of different materials
- Know that objects made of some materials can be changed in shape by bending, stretching, squashing and twisting. For example, clay can be shaped by squashing, stretching, rolling, pressing etc. This can be a property of the material or depend on how the material has been processed e.g. thickness

Art

- Know that we can make a pattern on a polystyrene block by removing parts that can be made into a printed pattern
- That making a pattern on a polystyrene tile means it can be replicated/repeated
- Rollers can be used to transfer paint evenly
- Know that there are a number of ways to create patterns on a polystyrene tile by using different tools

Personal, Social, Health & Relationships Education

Keeping Myself Safe

- Knowing when they feel safe or unsafe and having strategies to deal with situations when they do not feel safe
- Knowing the difference between surprises and secrets

Appreciate (My Happy Mind)

- Know what gratitude means and how we can express it
- Understanding how gratitude helps us

Rights and Respect

- Knowing how we can look after the school environment
- Know that we have choices about how we use money and that we can save money for the future
- Know that we can spend on essential and non-essential things

Relate (My Happy Mind)

- Learning how we can have good relationships with others
- Learning about the reactions of others
- Learning how Happy Breathing can help with relationships
