Message from Headteacher

Near Miss

I was informed of a near miss this week where a speeding car almost hit a parent and child leaving school after a club on Tuesday afternoon.

The parent returned to school to inform staff and was understandably shaken by this experience.

You will be aware of the considerable time spent patrolling and monitoring the roads surrounding our school at the start and end of the school day.

I received a letter from a concerned resident in Melkridge Close on Monday morning, complaining about cars parking on the pavements, close to corners and blocking driveways when dropping off or collecting children.

I am spending increasing time managing traffic related issues and parking. I would much rather be using this time doing positive things like communicating with you about children's achievements or implementing strategies to continue to enhance the work of our school.

I would implore all families to ensure that they drive and park responsibly around the school site. This will keep everyone safe and help us to maintain positive relations with those who live and work in the vicinity of our school.





Our fabulous Year 4 children are looking forward to dazzling parents and carers with a 'Multiplication Musical' on Thursday 12th February!


The aim of this production is to encourage the children to practise their times tables through singing, dancing and acting, while also giving them the opportunity to perform in front of an audience!


