

- When was Darwin alive? Find out on timelines and work out how much time has passed. Do the same for other famous explorers.

Science

- Draw 5 things that explorers used in the past when travelling around the world.
- Research animals. Why has a giraffe got a long neck? Why does a camel have a hump? Why do some birds have long beaks?
- Think about the environment and how human activity is affecting animals and their environments, e.g. Brazil rainforests; plastics in oceans. Design posters.
- Research and write a fact-file about a famous explorer such as Darwin.
