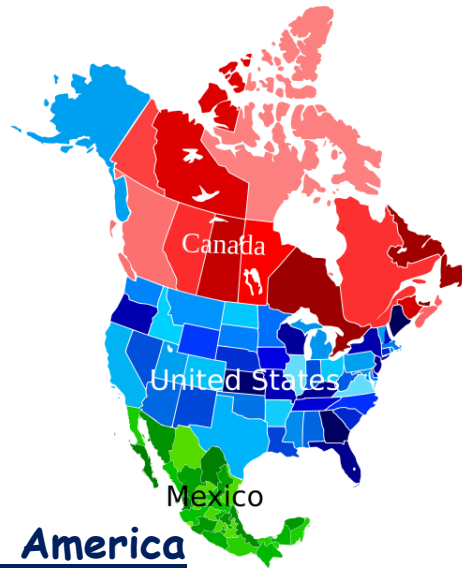


### English

### Expectations

### Maths

- Research currency from North American countries and compare with the UK pound.
- Work out distances from the UK to different North American countries.
- What time is it? Choose a time in the UK and find out the time in different North American countries. Work out the differences!
- Continue to practise your times tables!

### Art & Design

- Make well-known North American landmarks using materials such as cardboard, plasticine or Lego.
- Design vehicles to travel around different areas of North America. Think about differences in design for certain areas, such as the lakes, mountains and ice.
- Draw animals from North America.
- Animal print patterns.
- Research and create native North American artwork.
- Research, draw or make flags of North American countries.

### Science

- Think about the environment and how human activity is affecting animals and their environments, e.g. plastics in oceans. Design posters.
- Research and write a fact-file about a famous explorer or scientist from North America.

### Geography

- Study maps of North America. Recreate a map using accurate drawings.
- Research the countries of North America, including size, population, environmental features. Compare with the UK.
