



Week Beginning 2nd March 2026



In science this week we have been learning about light sources. First, we identified sources of light and then working in mixed groups we sorted them into natural and man-made.



In English the children have started to learn about Beatrix Potter. This week we created a shared knowledge box of facts and after some shared reading and research the children wrote and added their own interesting facts about Beatrix.

On Thursday we played MasterMind—where children tried to answer questions on Beatrix against the clock!

As part of some of Reception's learning based on Communication, Language and Literacy they have planted some vegetable seeds for Peter Rabbit to eat in Mr McGregor's garden! This experience opened up so many learning opportunities, children used mathematical language to sequence events. We found bulbs hidden in the compost so talked about what they need to grow. We even found worms! So we talked about how we should treat living things with respect and care.

In maths Reception have explored time and how long a minute is. The children have explored what they can do in a minute and whether it felt like a long / short time.

The Year 1's and 2's have been learning about length. They have carried out a measure hunt on the back yard in the glorious sunshine this week. It was so much fun but really educationally valuable too!



In other lessons / news the children have been learning about Lytham, St Annes and the coastal environment. The children have compared the environment to Sharneyford and located several places on a map. We have celebrated world book day by creating potato / egg characters which was lots of fun (and quite messy!) In PE we had an exciting lesson where we pretended to be in the jungle, we crawled and travelled in a variety of ways before putting our jumping skills to the test! The children jumped in and out of ladders and used hurdles to practise their technique. Well done Class 1!
