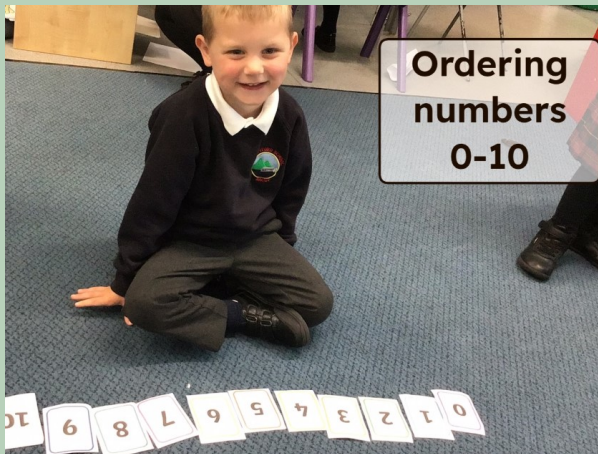
Aladdin is good because he got Jasmine away at the situation.
