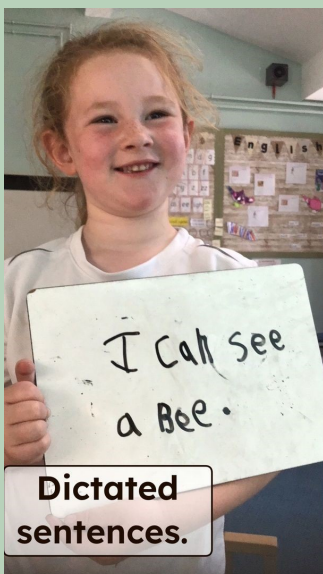
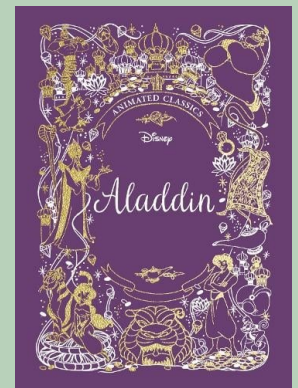
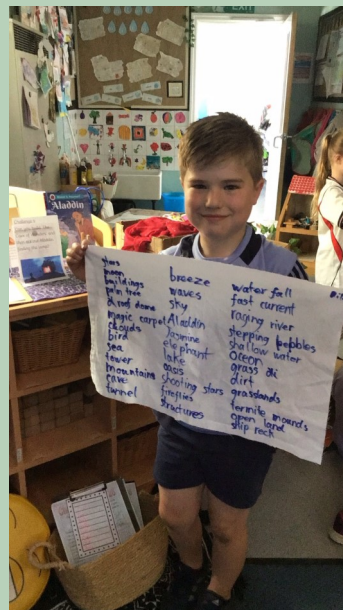
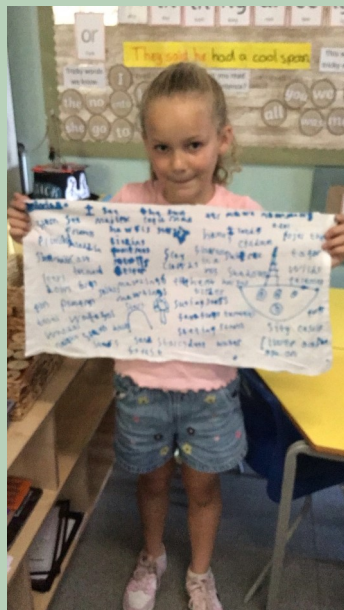


Week Beginning: 22nd June 2026

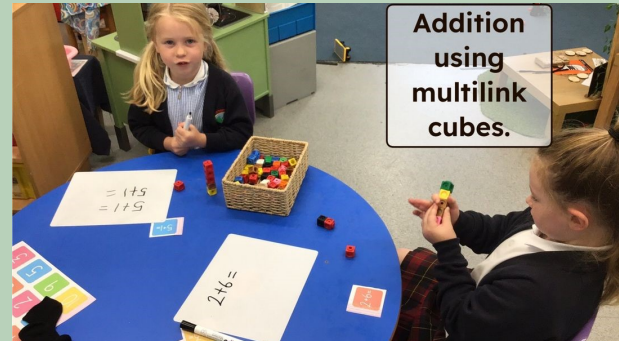
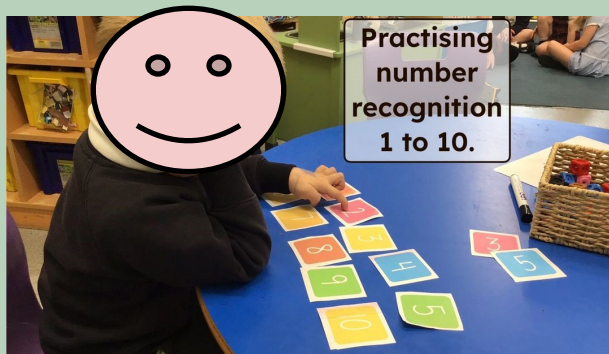

In Reception year we have been adding using practical resources. The children are working really hard now, completing complex challenges every week and getting ready for Year 1.

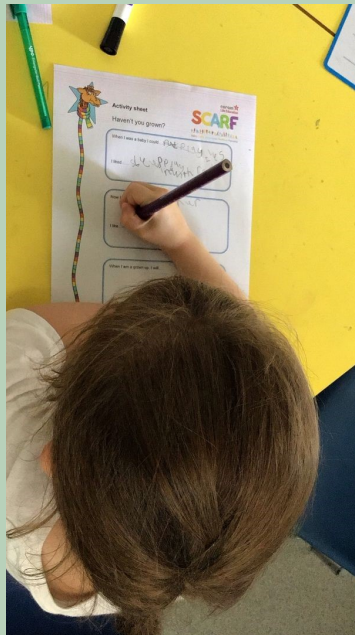
