Class 3 has had another busy and creative week of learning. In English, we have continued exploring The Nowhere Emporium, using the magical ideas from the story to inspire our own imaginative writing. The children designed their own mysterious rooms and extraordinary shops, thinking carefully about the sights, sounds and unusual features that visitors might discover. Their creativity and descriptive language have been fantastic, and we have enjoyed sharing some wonderfully inventive ideas with the class.

In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of inverse operations and how they can be used to check calculations. We have also worked on rounding numbers and using estimation to decide whether answers are reasonable. The children have shown increasing confidence when selecting strategies to solve problems and explain their thinking.

Our DT project on Anglo-Saxon longhouses has continued to take shape. This week, we strengthened the structures by adding extra support and reinforcement, making them more rigid and stable. The models are now ready for the next stage, when we will add wattle and daub walls.

In PE, the children demonstrated great determination and enthusiasm while practising their striking skills. Meanwhile, in RE, we enjoyed thoughtful discussions about the importance of saying sorry, considering what a genuine apology means and why forgiveness can be so important in our relationships with others.
