Maths: In Maths, year 5 children will be learning about fractions, decimals and percentages; ensuring we can convert between the 3. We will also be working more on multiplication and division and using the formal method to multiply and divide numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number.

In Maths, year 6 children will continue to learn about fractions, moving on to Ration and proportion and Algebra. We will then spend time looking at Decimals, Percentages and Statistics. To further support our learning in maths we will also complete Core Skills tasks each week which will include consolidation and pre-teaching of maths concepts. We will also be taking part in daily arithmetic challenges (Tough Ten).

English: English: In English, we will continue to build on our prior grammatical knowledge by using relative and subordinate clauses, the past perfect tense, fronted adverbials of time, modal verbs, parenthesis and direct speech. We will be applying our skills on work based on the 2 quality texts: Kai and the Monkey King and Malala's Magic Pencil. Year 6 will also be consolidating their use of the passive voice and using semi colons and colons to mark independent clauses.

Projects

May the Force be With You


In our Spring term science topic, we will be learning all about forces. We will learn about gravity, air resistance, friction and water resistance and will be carrying out carefully planned experiments to investigate the effects of these forces on moving objects.

Invaders or settlers? This topic has a predominantly history focus in which the children will learn about Britain's

settlement by Anglo Saxons and Scots. We will also learn about the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor. We will also look at some locational knowledge of UK linked to Anglo Saxons and Vikings in Geography. In Art, we will practice our sketching and sewing by learning all about the Bayeux tapestry. Finally, In DT we will design and make our own soup and bread.

PE Please can all PE Kits be in school throughout the school week. Our PE sessions will take place on a Monday and Thursday throughout this term. All children are to come to school wearing their PE tops on their PE days. Please can all items be clearly labelled.

Water bottles Please can all children bring in a labelled water bottle for them to use throughout their day at school.
