Essentials

Uniform: please make sure that EVERYTHING is labelled.

Long hair should be tied back.

Water bottles: still water.

Snack: healthy snacks (low fat, low sugar, no chocolate, no nuts). Unhealthy snacks will be saved for the end of the day. Please let me know if your child has any food allergies.

Book bags rather than back packs as storage is difficult.

No jewellery other than a small stud earring.

PE kit: bring to school each Monday and it will come home for washing on a Friday. We have two PE sessions per week, Wednesday and Thursday.

Earrings need to be removed by the child or, if this is not possible, covered with plasters provided by parents.

Waterproof coats and wellies as we will be outside as much as possible.

Expectations

The classroom still resembles our Early Years environment in order to help transition. Continuous Provision is still in place, although this will become more focused as the year goes on and learning will gradually become more 'formal'.

Outdoor area.

Stay and challenge will begin once the children have settled.

We will maintain our high expectations of respectful behaviour and following school rules.

Phonics and reading will once again be a huge priority. Please work with us and read with your child as often as possible, sharing their school reading book each day to improve fluency and sight vocabulary. Reading books will be kept for one week and changed each Friday.

Homework will be sent out electronically each Friday and should be returned by the following Wednesday. It will typically be a piece of maths and a phonics/ English challenge.

Volunteers:

If anyone is able to spare a small amount of time to listen to readers please let me, or another member of staff, know.

Attendance:

Our school attendance policy has been emailed to all parents.

We recognise that the majority of children have 'good' attendance (96%) and we work together with parents to ensure that your children are happy to come into school. If a child isn't in school they can't learn alongside their peers. Our learning is sequential so it can be difficult to fill gaps.

Example of the number of days absence and its impact over time

Parent's evenings will be held on 7th and 9th November.


Year 1 phonics screening check: week beginning 10th June 2024


(Please don't book a holiday during this week)

Phonics screening check

This assesses your child's knowledge of phonics and their ability to decode both real and pseudo words.

Forty words in total, 20 real and 20 pseudo or 'alien'. A meeting will be held later in the year to discuss it in more detail.
