
ENGLISH

Spider poetry- The Spider and the fly – Howitt & Dilitzi The Spinner – Dunn Official Spider Shuttle – Lang - positive / negative Blackout poetry

Gothic Genre- Coraline -writing a newspaper report on the missing parents. Write arguments for and against leaving the other mother to return home Look for evidence of characters changing during a story and discuss possible reasons, what it shows about the character and whether the change met or challenged children's expectations.

The Moth- Write non- chronological reports using The Moth as an example





Light and reflection - Proving that light travels in a straight line, children use this information to explain observations of reflection and shadows. Pupils investigate the effect of moving an object away from the surface it casts a shadow on and the relationship between the incoming and reflected rays on a mirrored surface. Exploring real uses of mirrors allow children to apply what they have learned about light throughout the unit.



GEOGRAPHY- What is life like living in THE ALPS?

Considering the climate of mountain ranges and why people choose to visit the Alps; focusing on Innsbruck and looking at the human and physical features that attract tourists; investigating tourism in the local area and mapping recreational land use; presenting findings to compare the Alps to the children's own locality.

Revisit identifying the continents, oceans and the countries in Europe

- Describe and make connections between examples of religious creativity (buildings and art.

- Apply ideas about values and from scriptures to the title question .
