





- listen to, read and retell stories about Winter and Cold Places, such as The Gruffalo's Child, Ten Little Lights
- learn about the story of Mr Wolf's Pancakes (Rising Stars Literacy scheme) and traditional tales, The Gingerbread Man, 'Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs
- find facts using non-fiction books
- continue to practise our phonics skills, letter formation to write letters, words, labels, captions and sentences with Read, Write Inc. Phonics
- continue to develop our blending and segmenting skills by reading story and nonfiction books during reading time, in the reading area and at home
- use the NCETM Maths scheme to continue to recognise numbers, count 1:1 and order numbers, learn about composition of a number, problem solving, such as one more/less and subitise numbers to 5 focusing on a die pattern
- continue to develop our knowledge of 2d and 3d shapes
- learn how to measure and describe length, height, such as longest, tallest etc.
- continue to develop social skills: sharing, turn-taking and developing friendships
- sing songs and create pictures about winter
- in PE, practise gymnastics and move in different ways
- explore sounds in music
- learn about Queen Elizabeth II and her family
- investigate melting solids to liquids
- in RE, learn about which people are special and why?

Topics are more child-led and planning will reflect the interests of the children. To inspire the children, we will plan themes. These may change due to interests and through observations.

Please could you:

- continue to read with your child daily and encourage them to learn their words cards, children need to be able to read these words by sight (not sounding out)
- practise phonics skills at home (see phonics newsletters on Dojo)
- encourage your child to write letters, words, sentences and captions
- take pictures of your child carrying out any activities at home to inform their Wonder Wall and encourage them to talk about these events, send in WOW certificates or post on Dojo
- look at and talk about numbers count, add and take away objects at home (see Maths home challenges)
- access Purple Mash computing activities, using your child's login information in their home/school diary
