

#### **SCIENCE**

#### **EVOLUTION & INHERITANCE**

Studying patterns in humans and other species, children learn about characteristics that are inherited and those that are environmental. Through the eyes of Darwin and Wallace, pupils understand how observations lead to theories. By modelling finches' variation and natural selection, they begin to explain how species evolve and the role of fossil evidence that supports this theory.

### What was life like in TUDOR BRITAIN?

Looking at Primary and secondary sources

Background of who the Tudors were- War of the Roses- Family tree of the Tudor monarchs and Henry VIII's six wives

Comparing Henry VIII and Elizabeth I, children learn about the changing nature of monarchy. They examine how monarchs tried to control their public images using portraits and royal progresses. Using Tudor inventories to investigate whether people were rich or poor, children learn what life was like for people in Tudor times.
