

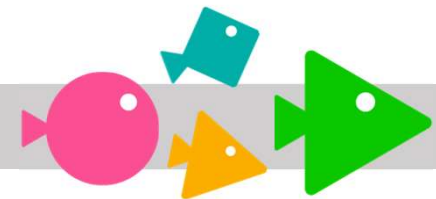

What if... Frankie tries to persuade Ash to watch it, saying they won't get into any trouble as no one will ever know...

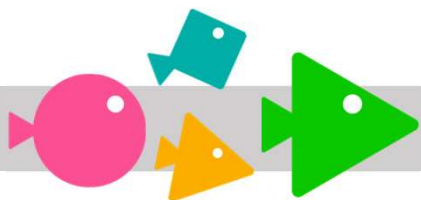

How can the family decide what to watch together?

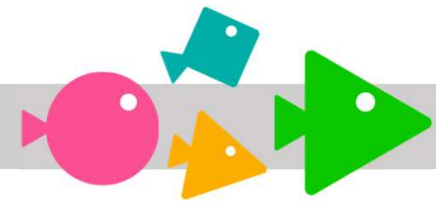
What if... they can't agree?

Is this a problem? Why? What could Fizz do? What should Fizz do?

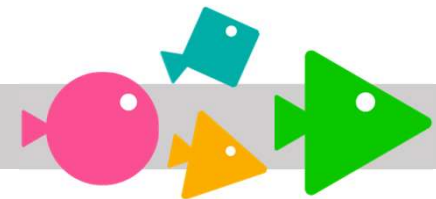
What if... Fabia explains she always watches 12 films at home – her mum always lets her and there is never anything bad in them?
