<p><b>Continent:</b> A solid area of land.</p>	
<p><b>Temperature:</b> : A thermometer is used to measure the temperature - how hot or cold it is.</p>	
<p><b>Ocean:</b> areas of salty water that fill enormous basins on the Earth's surface.</p>	
<p><b>Seas:</b> a small area of ocean with land on several sides.</p>	
<p><b>Country:</b> a distinct territory with defined borders, boundaries, people and government. <b>Holiday:</b> 'holy day' a long time ago holidays were based around religious festivals.</p>	
<p><b>Beach:</b> covered by material such as pebbles, sand, rocks and seashells.</p>	

**Equator:** An imaginary line around the centre of the Earth where the temperature is hot.

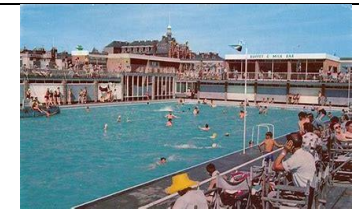
